Technical Rider for *Hunger* • Written and Performed by Ebony Stewart Revised 7/27/17

Running Time: 90 minutes Intermission: Optional Easy set up and strike. Festival ready.

Stage/Scenery:

•Producer provides an open stage space--at least 15x15 ft. Ideally a black box with walls.

•Producer provides floor swept and mopped for bare feet and able to handle breaking dishes.

•Producer provides card table and 2 sturdy chairs.

•Ebony provides 3 picture frames to be hung on stage walls. •If no walls, Producer provides 3 easels, stands, or hanging positions.

Negotiable/Optional Scenery:

Producer provides drum throne, small bookshelf with some books, and a 4x4 or 4x6 legged platform@ 2 ft tall.
Ebony writes words on the walls in chalk.

Props:

•2 forks, 2 knives, 2 spoons, and white ceramic dishes that will be broken during the show. Per performance: 2 plain white plates, 2 plain white mugs.

•Ebony can provide these props as needed with advanced notice.

Lighting:

•Lighting cues negotiable.

Producer provides a basic rep plot with options for color and 4 specials. Specials for Center stage platform and for the pictures Stage Right, Stage Left, and Up Center.
The show can be performed without specials if necessary.

•The show can be performed without specials if necessary •Full light plot by Patrick Anthony and full lighting cues provided upon request for a small fee to the designer. <u>padraig.7@gmail.com</u>

Sound:

•Ebony provides music and sound cues on a Qlab-ready thumb drive and on a CD. Other formats possible with advanced notice.

•There are 35 sound cues.

Technical Rehearsal:

•Producer provides one rehearsal prior to first performance. Ideally the day before the show.

•Ebony provides one cued Stage Manager script.

Tech Crew:

•Producer provides Stage Manager, Lighting Designer/Technician, and/or crew to run lights and 35 sound cues.

•Lighting cues negotiable.

Dressing Room:

•Producer provides a private, quiet space with mirror and bathroom for Ebony to prepare.

•Ebony provides the costume.

Poster:

•Ebony provides a poster template.

•Producer fills in the details for printing and distribution.

•Producer provides rigorous printing and distribution of posters and handbills.

•Producer provides any paid advertising.

Photos:

•Ebony provides publicity photos on her website.

•Producer credits all Hunger photos:

Photo by Christopher Diaz Photography.

Program:

•Producer provides show program to include: Hunger originally premiered at The VORTEX in Austin, Texas.

Directed by Zell Miller III. David Mark Cohen New Play Award and B. Iden Payne Award for Outstanding Lead Actress in a Drama.

Workshop:

•Ebony offers "What's Eating Me" in conjunction with the performance. This workshop provides the opportunity to explore what we are hungry for and to tell those stories. The workshop is ideally 4 hours on the day following the performances. Ebony can also do a basic version in 1 hour.

Travel:

 Producer provides reimbursement to the artist for airfare or ground transportation as needed. Ebony has an extensive, existing national touring schedule. She may not be traveling from or to her home base and will need to handle her travel details.
 Producer will assist with ground transportation including airport pickup and drop-off and transportation between venue and housing.

Housing:

•Producer provides a private room and bathroom – hotel, Air BnB, or private home.

Artist Fee:

•Negotiable based on number of performances. \$1600-\$2800.
